Parish Grounds Damaged by Adults and Children

Marston Road Playing Field has suffered damage this year. Play equipment has been vandalised, graffiti has been sprayed and written on the skate park, branches have been ripped off trees, fences have been damaged, gates demolished, gate posts and bins ripped from the ground, benches destroyed, fires lit and litter strewn across the grounds. Most of the damage has been caused at weekends and is thought to have been caused by children from the village. Parents are urged to make themselves aware of where their children are in the evenings and at weekends and to talk to them about treating the area with respect.

Damage isn't just caused by young people though. Despite there being a dedicated dog walk alongside Marston Road Playing Field, adults have been seen allowing their dogs to run onto the playing field. Dogs mess has been found on the football pitch and near the play area. The Parish Council would like to make it very clear that dogs are not allowed onto the Playing Field and that dog mess, even on the dog walk, must be picked up by the dog walker. The maximum penalty for not picking up after your dog is due to be increased shortly from £1000 to £4000. The Parish Council provide poop bags free of charge at the dog walk, Lapley Green and at Stretton. They are also available at the Post Office.

Dog mess is a health hazard and allowing your dog to foul on a children's play area is reckless and inconsiderate. Residents are urged to contact South Staffordshire Council on 01902 696000 if they witness a dog owner failing to clear up after their dog.

The Parish Council is funded completely by tax payers and spends around 30% of its budget looking after grounds in the parish. This includes play areas, the cemetery, skatepark, football pitch and Lapley Green. The more the Parish Council has to spend repairing vandalism, the less money it has to make improvements to the parish.

Could You Be A Parish Councillor?

Town and Parish Councils are the first tier of Local Government in England. Lapley, Stretton & Wheaton Aston Parish Council usually meets on the first Thursday of each month (except August) at 7.30pm. Elections take place every four years with the next election in May 2015. This is a great opportunity to take on responsibility for making decisions that affect residents in our parish. If elected you would help to make decisions on things such as council tax, planning applications, new housing, play areas, bus shelters, grounds maintenance and community facilities. It is a voluntary role but full training is offered free of charge. There are 7 seats in Wheaton Aston, 2 in Lapley and 2 in Stretton.

The Parish Council Manager will be running information sessions in the New Year.
