- **Community safety update**

This week, two men and seven teenagers have been arrested following a series of attempts to steal cars and enter properties in South Staffordshire. The first incident concerned a report of people seen in gardens in Clee View Road, Wombourne, just before 1am on Tuesday 25 June 2019. Two 16-year-olds were arrested on suspicion of attempted burglary and a 15-year-old and 18-year-old were arrested on suspicion of burglary. All are from the Dudley area.

In a second incident, there was a report at 2.45am of two men attempting to break into a car in Huddlestone Close, Featherstone. Officers arrested four teenagers - aged 15, 16, 17 and 17 - and one man, aged 20, all from Wolverhampton on suspicion of theft of a motor vehicle.
